## Management Planning

#### Path Forward for Management Planning

The Board cancelled the OTL Management Planning session, and made plans for a replacement model.

#### The Community-driven model/Staffdriven model hybrid

The Board has developed a new community-driven approach to developing the Edéhzhíe Management Plan. From December 2021- February 2022, the planning team visited with three communities to work through key management questions. The Board discussed the results at its March meeting, and directed the next steps in plan development. Due to COVID concerns, Pehdzeh Ki will be scheduled in Spring.

DFN will start building the plan through regular virtual meetings, bringing progress to the Board for input and guidance. The planning team will return for a **second community tour** over the summer to work through the next set of questions with communities.

### **Dene Worldview**

 The Board has requested input from DFN leadership on how to incorporate Dene Worldview in its management planning. This discussion will be on the next DFN Leadership Meeting Agenda.



# Management Planning (cont)

This model helps increase community participation and will allow Board and EHC members to participate in their community planning sessions with the Edéhzhíe planning team, ensuring that all vital inputs are gathered at once and concerns are addressed early.

The planning team consists of Herb Norwegian (Board Chair), Heidi Wiebe (Board Planner), and Ashley Menicoche (Regional Coordinator). ECCC may have a staff person join the planning team for the second round.







# Management Planning (cont)

The first workshop was held in Deh Gáh Got'ie Kúé on December 6-9, 2021. Tthets'éhk'edélį representatives joined this workshop. Members of the Elders/Harvester Committees and Dene and Métis leadership began to develop:

- the Harvesting Protocol,
- the Vision and Goals for Edéhzhíe,
- Values and their current health,
- **Threats** to Edéhzhíe, and **strategies** to address them.

Participants discussed how Dene Worldview should be reflected in planning, and the types of land uses participants foresee happening in Edéhzhíe by Dehcho Dene, and non-S. 35 Rights holders. Community members discussed monitoring for threats and the indicators to measure for healthy wildlife and land protection in Edéhzhíe.





# Management Planning (cont)

The first workshop was held in Łudlų Kų́ę́ on February 15-17, 2021. Łudlų Kų́ę́ members of the Elders/Harvester Committees and community members began to develop:

- the Harvesting Protocol,
- the Vision and Goals for Edéhzhíe,
- Values and their current health,
- **Threats** to Edéhzhíe, and **strategies** to address them.

Participants discussed how Dene Athít'e and self-expression of section 35 rights would be aligned with conservation planning, and how to approach permitting in Edéhzhíe. Positive Dene/ section 35 engagement with the land was added to the list of healthy outcomes.

Pehdzeh Ki will organize their meeting in Spring, 2022.





## Management Planning (cont.)

#### **Treaty and Inherent Rights**

DFN is contracting a legal review of the Edéhzhíe Establishment Agreement in relation to treaty and inherent Rights to ensure that Dehcho rights are not being impacted.

DFN does not have a land claim agreement yet and the DFN has not given up their land or treaty rights. There are concerns that the use of federal legislation might impact Dehcho Dene rights to use the land. Edéhzhíe was put forward by DFN for protection and is a community-driven process. **The Establishment Agreement confirms the ongoing exercise of harvesting rights in Edéhzhíe once fully established as a National Wildlife Area on May 5, 2022.** 

One of the key questions for Board and the Parties to resolve is the extent which the Edéhzhíe Management Plan can restrict non-Dehcho Dene section 35 rights holders from using Edéhzhíe. The Board may set principles for use through a Harvesting Protocol that could manage non-Dehcho Dene access on a case-bycase basis.



## Management / Operational Decisions

#### National Wildlife Area Establishment


ECCC completed the preliminary screening process. Final establishment of Edéhzhíe as a National Wildlife Area is expected to be completed by May 5, 2022.

#### Edéhzhíe Fund

DFN has finalized the Edéhzhíe Fund as of March 31, 2022. DFN can use the interest from the Fund for the annual management and operational expenses of Edéhzhíe. ECCC has provided \$10 million and DFN will utilize the development of a fundraising strategy to find matching funds.

#### Communications

EMB meetings will be recorded for use in future communications. The Edéhzhíe team are expanding their social media presence to keep community members informed of the activities relating to management and operations in Edéhzhíe.



# Dehcho K'éhodi

#### **Tracking Guardian Harvests**

ECCC requested that guardians start tracking the harvesting they are involved in. Food security is a benefit to DFN from the guardians program. Monetizing the value of harvests will help in future reviews and assessments of the Establishment Agreement. DFN committed to track the actual benefits post establishment.

#### **Guardians Activities**

Guardians from each of the communities assisted ECCC to deploy wildlife cameras and ARUs (acoustic recording devices) from November 3rd-10th, 2021. They went out in two teams, deploying equipment at 155 stations throughout Edehzhie.

While patrolling, Guardians collect information about wildlife, traffic, and people on the land. Through monitoring they further understand how to gather and keep data. Regional/Community coordinators will develop a protocol/template to record patrol data.





# Dehcho K'éhodi (cont.)

# Trail clearing is to take place over the winter months 2021/2022.

Communities plan to have cabin materials brought to their sites in spring and built by Fall, 2022.


Guardians are available to help with community activities to gain experience, training, and to be out on the land. Edéhzhíe work will be prioritized over community work in the event of conflicts.

#### **Research and Monitoring**

ENR is planning to do boreal woodland caribou collaring and aerial suveys in the Dehcho (including over Edéhzhíe) in February and March, 2022. The Board has accepted their Wildlife Research Permit Application.

If communities receive applications for research or land use in Edéhzhíe, please forward them to your local Edéhzhíe Community Coordinator or board member. **Project leaders must seek permission from the Board for work in Edéhzhíe**.
